Texas 4-H Foundation Opportunity Scholarship

- The scholarship program is overseen by the Texas 4-H Youth Development Foundation.
- An estimated \$2.8 million will be given at the Texas 4-H
 Roundup Scholarship Assembly (Value of \$1,000 \$20,000)
- Over 200 scholarships will be awarded in 2024
- 4-H Scholarships are **ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIPS** awarded based on academic record, 4-H experience, and financial need (certain scholarships; not all).

Recent Program Changes/Reminders

- Applications will be submitted via Texas 4-H Foundation Scholarship Portal (https://texas4hfoundation.org/about-scholarships/)
- Will not be using CEA verification form. CEA's will receive list of applicants submitted by deadline for approval/enrollment verification/eligibility.
- Applicants invited to interview will do a "self-signup" for interview time (first come-first serve)
- Check the dates for scholarship interviews/presentations to make sure you would be available if offered an interview/ scholarship
- ACT/SAT not required again this year for the 4-H Opportunity Scholarship.
- Members receiving a Terry Scholarship are NOT eligible to receive a Texas 4-H Opportunity Scholarship (same as past few years)





Recent Program Changes/Reminders

- Pay close attention to your attachments must be uploaded as PDF Documents
- No quotas are set for counties, districts, or regions!
- Fort Worth Stock Show is the only livestock show donor that requires participation in their show.
- Note that A recipient of any Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo Scholarship may not receive more than \$110,000 total from financial aid or any other scholarships and remain eligible to receive the Show scholarship.
- Financial aid confirmation will only be collected just before the interview
- DONORS set the criteria!
- Each applicant receives a total score. Scores are sorted highest to lowest and applicants are matched with the MAXIMUM dollar scholarship for which the applicant qualifies.





Recent Program Changes/Reminders

- Scholarships restricted to a major, a college, and/or course of study is verified each semester during the duration of scholarship. DON'T LIE TO GET A SCHOLARSHIP – IT WILL CATCH UP TO THE APPLICANT!
- Make sure high school academic proficiency has been met and college entrance exams have been taken early and often.
- Narratives that have only been written once are rarely effective!
- Printer problems and computer crashes are a fact-of-life, plan and manage your time.
- High school counselors need time to collect official transcripts for submission.





4-H Foundation Scholarships Available

o Baccalaureate

• Students pursuing a Bachelor of Science or Bachelor of Arts.

o Technical

Students pursuing a technical certification.

o Courageous Heart

- For baccalaureate or technical students.
- 4-H members that have overcome obstacles related to medical, family, and/or education.

o Collegiate

- Former 4-H members who are college students.
- Completed 30 hours at a grade point average of at least 2.7.



General Eligibility Requirements

- ACTIVE 4-H member for current and at least two of the three previous years.
- Be a United States citizen.
- Be a Texas resident.
- Scheduled to graduate from a Texas High School (public, private, home) during the 2023-2024 year.
- Been accepted into a <u>Texas</u> College, University, or technical school by the time of interview.





General Eligibility Requirements

- Completed and passed all necessary standardized test(s)/requirements for graduation and met the entrance requirements for the college/university for which formal application has been made.
- Applicant may apply for a Texas 4-H and Texas FFA scholarship, however some restrictions may apply
- Submit a 2024 scholarship application via the Texas 4-H
 Foundation online portal (Only required supplemental
 documents have been included –transcript, FAFSA, CH
 letters.)
- Applicants who receive a Terry Foundation Scholarship are
 NOT eligible to receive a Texas 4-H Opportunity Scholarship
- Application must be complete and correct.
- Once submitted, no updates allowed.





Baccalaureate Eligibility

- There is not a quartile ranking minimum to apply but based on scholarship criteria, some scholarships require an applicant to be in the upper one-quarter (1/4) of his/her class.
- ACT/SAT not required again this year for the 4-H Opportunity Scholarship.





Technical Eligibility

- Must not have plans to continue formal education at a Texas college and/or university after the completion of a technical program.
- Do not have to meet the minimum SAT/ACT or class ranking requirements, however, they must demonstrate through their application future potential academic achievement





Courageous Heart Eligibility

- Complete additional sections in the application & Letters of recommendation/support (3)
- Courageous Heart applicants cannot be considered for <u>other</u> Texas 4-H Opportunity scholarships.
- Have WRITTEN documentation of obstacles.
- o Maximum Scholarship value is \$5,000.





Collegiate Scholarship Eligibility

- United State citizen & Texas resident.
- Been an active 4-H member in Texas.
- Attending a Texas College/University.
- Been graduate for at least one (1) year prior to award.
- Completed thirty (30) hours of undergraduate work.
- 2.7 cumulative GPA at time of application.
- *Separate application and guidelines



- Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) Student Aid Report (SAR).





Scholarship Application Portal



For students who wish to pursue a Bachelor of Science (BS) or Bachelor of Arts (BA) degree from an accredited Texas College or University.

General Requirements

- 1. Must be a current Texas 4-H member.
- 2. Must be a Texas 4-H member for at least 2 of the last 3 years for a minimum of 3 years of participation.
- 3. Must be a U.S. Citizen.
- 4. Must be a Texas Resident.
- 5. Must make a formal application to enroll in a college/university in the state of Texas for Fall 2024.
- 6. Must complete and pass all standardized test(s)/requirements for graduation.
- 7. Must submit a completed transcript showing 3.5 years of course work WITH GRADES.

- Click on the blue "APPLY" button to the top right of the description to begin!

NOTE: Please DO NOT use any personal identifying information in your document file name. You will create a unique application identifier within your application and you should use that in the file name. Preferred file name format is subject.APPID.


If awarded any of the Terry Scholarship, you will not be eligible for a Texas 4-H Opportunity Scholarship.



- Include any personal obstacles that the applicant has over come during their 4-H career.
- Space should be used wisely and do not repeat, or re-list information already addressed in the application.
- **DO NOT** use your name in the narrative.
- Must be written in the box no attachment option

Personal Narrative*

Write a personal narrative about yourself, highlighting any important facts and information you believe the selection committee should know when considering your application. This would include such things as your history in 4-H, any personal obstacles you have overcome, the greatest thing you will take from 4-H, and how 4-H will help you in the future. Do not repeat any information already contained in the application and <u>DO NOT</u> use your name in the narrative.

Career Narrative

- Must be written in the box no attachment option
- Applicant should describe how they have prepared themselves to have an awareness of and an understanding about career(s) applicable to the degree or technical certification they wish to pursue.
- Types of information the applicant may provide includes:
 - Visits to colleges/universities and conversations with personnel at those institutions.
 - Investigations of job/career opportunities and availability.
 - Persons/experiences that have influenced the applicant to pursue this degree/certification.
 - How the applicant decided between pursuit of an associates degree/technical certification versus baccalaureate or vice-versa.

Career Narrative*

Describe how you have prepared yourself to have an awareness of and an understanding about career(s) applicable to the degree you wish to pursue. Type of information you may provide include:

- · Visits to college/universities and conversations with personnel at those institutions
- · Investigations of job/career opportunities and availability
- Persons/experiences that have influenced you to pursue the degree/certification you have indicated.
- · How you decided to pursue a technical certification versus baccalaureate or vice-versa

Courageous Heart Narrative*

Please provide a detailed narrative of the obstacles that you have, or are in the process of, overcoming. Please include how long you have been dealing with the obstacle, person(s) who has helped you through your situation, how has 4-H played a positive role in overcoming your obstacle, etc. This narrative should include details about family situations such as: care of family members, medical (personal or family), learning disabilities, family financial burdens, etc. The more complete the essay, the better the judges can evaluate your need.

Courageous Heart Application Information

Please provide <u>three</u> letters of recommendation. Recommendation letters should provide detailed information on the obstacle, how the applicant has overcome the described obstacle and continued to be successful in their 4-H career and education, along with specific reasons the applicant should be considered for the Courageous Heart Scholarship.

Letters should be a maximum of one page in length.

- Did you complete this process and receive your SAR
- Must have a EFC Estimated Family Contribution
- Must upload a copy of the FAFSA SAR

o Ranking & GPA

- Have a meeting with your school administrator and get the correct contact email
- Follow up with your school administrator

o CEA Review & Assistance

- Agent can help review application for correctness, quality and completion but it
 is up to the applicant to contact the agent and request help
- Applicants have ability to collaborate with agents within the application portal using the collaborate tool. Instructions can be found on the Foundation website.





Ask Yourself

- Do I meet the basic criteria/requirements?
- Is the application complete?
- Has the story been told?
- Has spelling and grammar been checked?
- Is the application easy to read (minimum 10 point font)?
- Has the FAFSA SAR individual report been?
- Have transcripts/test scores been requested?
- Are narratives well written and edited?
- Are all of my attachments uploaded & in PDF form?
- Has my application been reviewed by multiple people?
- Has a submission category been identified?





The number one thing to remember:

START EARLY, EDIT OFTEN, SAVE OFTEN!

Brainstorm and gather information before you start.

Read and follow instructions/directions.

Ask several people that the applicant respects to review and critique the application.

Complete all sections –Not Applicable means NO SCORE! Emphasize quality –as well as quantity!
